Superintendent Eldridge give an update on his departments:

Highway – Fuel Consolidation Phase III, DOT has approved to move the funding from the Wells site to Lake Pleasant and Morehouse now that Wells is no longer interested. Mr. Rhodes is trying to estimate what the cost will be so they can decide if they will need a change order or to re-bid this portion of the project.

He received a two week notice from one of his MEO's in Long Lake, so he will have an opening. He didn't receive a lot of interest in the HEO job ad for Indian Lake but did received two applications.

Superintendent Eldridge checked to make sure the towns received the new CHIP's information he sent out. We are back to our base level which is \$438 million and a \$100 million of pave money on top of that. Everyone should have seen an increase. The Bridge NY was also passed but he doesn't have any information as of yet.

He will have his road schedule completed by next week now that he has his CHIP's budget confirmed. Most of the county roads are now open with an exception of a couple that are still posted.

Mr. Farber reported Mr. Dan Wilt spoke with Superintendent Eldridge in regards to the IDA property on Oak Mountain Road. The county was approached to see if the IDA working with the county highway could assist with some shared services for road improvements with hope that the Village of Speculator would take the road and pave it. This would open up the possibility of the Village to use CHIP's funds to do this.

Mr. Towers asked if we would be sharing services with the Village. Mr. Farber stated that was his understanding.

Buildings:

Superintendent Eldridge met with Director Kleppang to discuss open office space at the Lake Pleasant County Building. Community Services will be moving out of the Lane Emporium at the end of April. The plan will be for them to utilize the two offices across from Personnel. They would like to make one room the reception area and the other as the meeting room and by doing that they requested a door be installed between the two rooms that way they don't have to go into the hall to get to either room. They would only be using this a couple times a week so other offices such as Probation could also use it if needed.

Superintendent Eldridge reported they received one application for the part-time cleaner and will be interviewing soon.

The Jail project is very close to being completed, approximately one more week.

## Solid Waste:

Superintendent Eldridge discussed the memo he sent to all the members. Over the last few years DANC has been doing spot checks. He received a call from them and was asked about our recycling because they found recyclables in a couple of our loads and that makes us look bad. Plus we are also trying to get our contract extended with them and this doesn't help. He is not sure how that happened but they will be more diligent at the transfer stations but he also needs the towns to do the same.

Mr. Farber talked about the possibility of sole sourcing recyclables and that might get the tax payer to be more diligent also. The committee continued to discuss recycling glass, plastics, paper, brush, etc.

The next thing that each town is going to start having problems with is burnt houses. All this has to go through the weigh stream. The last time we transferred these types of materials out we were told that we needed asbestos testing done. We can't take any more chances but it is also costing us more and more money all the time. It is going to get hard to get rid of materials from structure fires.

For Fleet Coordinator – Mr. D. Wilt and Mr. Farber will discuss with Public Health what two cars they are passing down.

The Court system is looking to purchase one of the counties turned down cars because the car they have will not pass inspection any longer. He has been maintaining their car and billing the State for maintenance for some time now.

Mr. Farber discussed the Department of Social Services is looking for us to approve a press release that our investigator will be doing enforcement for residents that are possibly taking advantage of the system. He will bring this up again at the May meeting.

Mr. Farber asked if they felt they needed a Health Committee meeting prior to the Board meeting due to two resolutions that are in, one is for Ms. Warrington to be appointed as Director of Patient Services and the other is a transportation resolution for an Indian Lake child to a center based facility.

Mr. Towers stated he felt there wasn't a need for a committee meeting prior.

The Sheriff requested to re-hire Eric Dale as a Temporary Corrections Officer to help cover the jail and this is not really a five day letter. He has gotten approval from all of the members except Mr. Wells. Mr. Farber will approve the re-hire for the Sheriff and then discuss it with Mr. Wells because they need Mr. Dale tonight to fill in.
