Bid Opening:

Tracy Eldridge, Highway Superintendent, explained what repairs are needed. They will be making the current steps true and level and then placing granite and stone over them. He feels that this will be a permanent fix.

AUTHORIZING BIDS FOR TRANSPORTATION FOR A PRESCHOOL CHILD FROM LONG LAKE TO CHILDREN'S CORNER IN TUPPER LAKE, NY

WHEREAS, Hamilton County is obligated to provide roundtrip transportation for Hamilton County children receiving Early Intervention or Preschool Special Education services that cannot be provided in the home setting, and WHEREAS, the HCPHNS staff encourage parents to provide transportation, which however is not an option for this family beginning September 4, 2019, be it

RESOLVED, that bids for roundtrip transportation from Long Lake to Children's Corner in Tupper Lake, NY be solicited from vendors for the 2019 fall and spring school sessions.

Other Reports:

The Chairman discussed the mapping project. Initially it was Forestport, Webb and Inlet. They have since expanded to take in the Route 28 corridor now therefore impacting Arietta, Long Lake and Blue Mountain. It is his understanding that the communities just listed in conjunction with Forestport and Webb are going to be using Ezra Schwartz to do some mapping. He thinks the pricing is \$2,700. The mapping relates to the interception of Broadband coverage and 911 mapping. The main conflict with respect to no one having one easy to read map is the fact that Spectrum, in order to release their data, forces the municipalities to enter into a non-disclosure agreement. The Broadband program office map shows, for any location and any census track when clicked upon, who the providers are that are available. He thinks that Essex and Franklin Counties are working with Mr. Schwartz to do their mapping. Ms. Schwartz is also working with Forestport, Webb, Inlet, Long Lake, Arietta and Blue Mountain for the Route 28 corridor. The proposal is for an additional \$1,000 and they would do the mapping countywide. The question he has is, what is the value of that mapping to the remainder of the county. He asked the Supervisors already involved with the mapping if there is value. The Supervisors discussed it further. There are a couple of different issues with the towns. The Chairman stated that he doesn't understand why they have to buy a map for the rest of the County that shows what another map already shows. The Chairman stated that this was a generous offer but not sure the value. He was just in Albany testifying about how he feels that Broadband didn't go far enough. There were too many people left behind.

Mr. Seaman asked where we were with Frontier's Service and Repair. He has a telephone line down in Long Lake that is municipal and it has been like this for a month. The Chairman asked if he had the documentation regarding a ticket called in. He also stated that this is a good example of a great case study to take to Legislators and the Public Service Commission because this shows exactly what's going on; no logical prioritization and just an overwhelming lack of capacity service responsiveness. He asked Mr. Seaman to share the information he has.

As there was no further business, motion to adjourn by Mr. Frey, seconded by Mr. Seaman. Carried.
