SECOND SESSION

FEBRUARY 4, 2016

The Board convened at 10:30 A.M. in the Supervisors' Chambers at the Court House, Lake Pleasant, New York, with the Chairman, William G. Farber presiding. Mr. Farber led the members of the Board of Supervisors in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, and an opening prayer.

The Clerk, Mrs. Laura Abrams, called the roll with the following Supervisors answering:

A motion was made to accept the minutes of January 7, 2016 by Mr. Frey, seconded by Mr. Edwards. Mr. D. Wilt reported a typo on page 34 of 39 and will email it to the Clerk of the Board. Carried.

Public Comment: Mr. Croote from Hamilton County Soil and Water Conservation District handed out their 2015 Annual Report.

Bid Opening:

Superintendent Eldridge will take the bids back to his office to review and will have our engineer Mr. Rhodes review them. He will then set up a Public Works committee meeting within the next few weeks to discuss.

Reports of Standings/Special Committees:

Mr. Towers: He and Mr. Wells attended the Local Government Review Board in Keene Valley. They discussed the SLMP with regards to Essex Chain and bike cycling on non-native materials. They also discussed primitive tent sites in regards to boat launches and lean-tos.

Mr. Wells felt the discussion was lost in regards to the primitive tent sites due to all the proposed changes that were discussed in the SLMP. If anyone gets a chance please look at the plan because he has some issues with the RV parking in wild forest. Jason Kemper has issues with the boat launches, his concerns are specific to the SLMP.

The Chairman stated the general concern is the implementation it could have with Raquette Lake and with boat launches and lean-to issues.

Mr. Towers reported that he and Mr. Edwards attended Inter-County in Lowville. They had a presentation from Kraft's Philadelphia Cream Cheese facility. They are doing a major expansion and creating 150 new jobs. There was some discussion on minimum wage which they are strongly opposed to. They also discussed the dissolution of County IDAs and being replaced by CFAs. They are asking for County support through resolutions for their local IDAs.

The Chairman reported that he was unaware of this. He was attending NYSAC at the time and it was never brought up. They were looking for support on bonding issues and that was all he knew of.

Mr. Towers stated the proposed changes by DEC of the 480A program did not make it through the Executive budget so they are working with some other associations to get them support.

Mr. R. Wilt: Monday at 10:00 AM there will be a meeting with Mark Hoppe from Blue Wing to discuss East Mountain.

On Wednesday at 10:00 AM he has a conference call with Frontier to discuss addressing and PSAP.

The renovations are almost done at the jail; they are working on re-engineering some beams.

Mr. Wells: Reported Fred Monroe's retirement party was well attended.

The Chairman attended the joint Inter-County meeting yesterday with Kevin King as presenter for Taste of NY and the minimum wage issue did come up.

Other Reports:

Mr. Towers: Reported the Western Inter-County did not support the statewide UTV and asked the Chairman if he got a chance to ask if it was discussed.

The Chairman stated not really, he feels that not much will happen with the UTV until people understand what the concerns are. He did speak with a representative from Lewis County prior to the meeting and their feeling was they weren't prepared or it wasn't the right time to discuss it with Western Inter-County.

Mr. D. Wilt: Is looking into the towns' competitive salaries and wants to do town comparisons but needs information on the benefit packages they offer.

The Chairman reported Budget Officer Mezzano has gathered a lot of information from other counties which could also be helpful for him.

The Chairman stated they will have a Finance meeting on Committee Day to review the information that Budget Officer Mezzano has gathered.

We are also in need of two reps for the Hamilton County Fish and Wildlife Management Board. When the resolution was done there was a vacant landowner rep alt position and now we need a sportsmen rep also. If anyone has someone that is interested please let him know.

The Chairman attended the Emergency Management training at NYSAC.

The Chairman reported he chairs NYSAC's Standing Committee on Economic Development and Environment and Rural Affairs and they discussed budget issues regarding Broadband. There are a couple of areas that we need to gain a better understanding, but either has an impact on Hamilton County. First the only real data source that is consistent statewide is the FCC data with respect to where broadband exists and where it doesn't. The challenge with FCC that many counties have raised, is that they do it by census block. If one person in the census block has broadband then FCC makes the assumption that everyone does which is not always the case. So the stance is how do we create the data or update data for the purpose of the new NY Broadband Program in a way that we can take that into consideration in the grant scoring.

Mr. Towers asked how big the census maps are. Are they by county?

The Chairman stated no, there are multiple census blocks. The reason why we don't come into play is we don't have any areas that are mapped as having the twenty-five or one hundred meg. He continued to explain.

The Chairman has a couple copies of the NYSAC budget if anyone wants to look at it. As Superintendent Eldridge pointed out there are a couple of pots of money in there for infrastructure for roads and bridges that could be very good for Hamilton County. Certainly we are in a better position than we have been in past years. NYSAC has two main priorities this year, which are infrastructure and the state taking over the public defense system.

The navigation is another piece. The Sheriff sent a letter to the state. We can't continue to provide navigation law enforcement because we have gone from 75% funding to 50% and now to 25% funding. It would be hard not to scale back and simply say DEC you provide the navigation law enforcement on our lakes.

What we need to be aware of in this particular budget is that this proposal eliminated the Medicaid Cap for New York City. That is a billion dollars' worth of savings and that is the funding associated with a lot of other things. NYSAC is in a quandary of being in a position where this could be a

slippery slope; if they eliminate this where is the protection for counties regarding the Medicaid Cap. It might not go away in the future and if you take that position and if you secure the Medicaid Cap and push back the only way at this time, that the legislatures, assembly or senate can do a billion dollar restoration is to take the money from somewhere else.

Mr. Wells asked the Chairman to explain the State Landfill money.

The Chairman reported as part of a settlement that Essex and Hamilton County negotiated back when Essex County's landfill was taking out of county waste or was proposing to and Hamilton County was looking at the idea of creating a landfill in Perkins Clearing. At that time the Pataki administration, who was working with us to develop a deal whereby waste would not be imported into the Adirondacks. As part of that we made the argument that it was a significant disadvantage for counties like Hamilton that wouldn't be able to have their own landfill and would have to export waste. So we not only got three million dollars for transfer stations but we also received a twenty year agreement for them to subsidies the transportation of waste out of the Adirondack Park for one hundred and fifty thousand a year. Now it has been cut three thousand dollars. A short discussion followed on the closures of the landfills.

As there was no further business, motion to adjourn by Mr. D. Wilt, seconded by Mr. Wells. Carried.
